

MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

This Sunday we enter into the fourth week of Advent leading to the Feast of Christmas on Friday December 25th. What a journey it's been for us, and for Mary and Joseph! Both journeys have been arduous, full of twists and turns, exhausting and sometimes fearful. Since the start of 2020 we've been looking over our shoulders afraid that Coronavirus would catch us up and destroy us in body and soul. Stoically we plodded on knowing that at some stage of the journey we would find a cure for the disease. After much searching, thank God, we have found a cure, the end of the punishing journey is in sight.

Mary and Joseph had their gruelling journey. Most of the time it was demanding and challenging as they set out to Bethlehem.
