SAINTS: This week we see three Saints celebrated by the Universal Church: St Vincent de Paul (27th Sept), St Michael and all Angels (29th Sept) and St Cadoc (24th Sept).

Cadoc was a leading figure among Welsh Saints and a founder of Llancarfan Community of Monks near Rhoose in the Vale of Glamorgan. He was a contemporary of David and was known in Ireland. He, like many of his time, kept the Faith alive throughout the "Dark Ages". They were like tea-lights floating on a sea of darkness and despondency. We live in another age of darkness, so we, like Cadoc should shine with the light of Christ being signs of hope and joy within our troubled world. Let us pray for the people of the Parish of St Cadoc and their priest Fr Gray.

Michael: My parents gave me the name 'Michael' "Who is like God". I know this is not always the case! He is the protector and guardian and principal fighter of evil. So I pray that he will protect us all from the evil of Satan. Since 1969, the Church also included Raphael and Gabriel. I was Parish Priest in Barry of the Parish of St Michael and All Angels and also of the Parish (the only one in Britain and Ireland named Gabriel and Raphael) in Tonypandy. Let us on this day pray for the people of Barry and Tonypandy.

Vincent de Paul: one of the Greats! He exemplifies true devotion to Christ through his service to the old, sick and destitute. A French priest born in the 1600s who founded the Vincentians and the Sisters of Charity (here in our Diocese in St Francis Ely). His mission is carried on within this Parish and throughout the world by the largest lay organisation within the Church: the SVP. Our small but committed band of Vincentians work within the Parish visiting the sick and housebound and helping those who are in need --practical help. They need more people to carry on the work. WHY NOT YOU! And to those who DO -- Thank you.

SVP AWARENESS MONTH This weekend we will be having a retiring collection for the victims of the flood disaster in Kerala, India. Each SVP group has a twinned Conference in Kerala and this weekend there will be an appeal at the end of Mass with more information.
