

# "EVANS! Stop talking and pay attention!"

In the 50s and 60s there was a magazine for children: not so much a comic, but an educational magazine, called "Look + Learn". Very much like the children's programme, Blue Peter, more an educational programme rather than just entertainment.

As I write these few words, teachers throughout the UK, including those in our Primary School, are still teaching through the wonders of the Internet. As an ex teacher, or should I say 'still a teacher', I wish to add another word to 'Look + Learn' that is 'Listen'. So it should read

"Look, Listen and Learn"

You've heard me say so often that teachers who taught me would always write

"Michael should learn to listen and to observe".

Jesus was called Rabbi, teacher. Those He taught, listened to His words of preaching and they were inspired because He taught them with Authority. They were challenged to change their style of living, they hung onto every word, observing everything Jesus did. "Look, Listen + Learn"


Mass is still being celebrated for your intentions and those who are lonely and the desperate, and for those who are trying to alleviate the problems of the sick.
