

MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

For a number of years Joe Boardman, Bob Reardon, the late and respected John Meredith and I would head to Rome at the start of each New Year. This 'Cultural Tour' has many happy memories of the visits we made to this historical City's bars and restaurants --- yes, we also paid the odd visit to a Church and museums.

The banter was always the same when we reached the Airport at Bristol. Our luggage was placed in the hold of the aircraft thus allowing us to travel with large suitcases. " He instructed them to take nothing for the journey, except a staff; no bread, no haversack, no coppers for purses and no spare tunic....." Rely on Providence.


