


The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended.

MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE


Around this time of year a number of us would travel to Rome but sadly we were unable to journey to the Eternal City due to the Coronavirus. During the past week we celebrated the Feast of St Agnes, which brought to mind our visit last year to the Church of St Agnes, in the Piazza Narona, Rome. It was built around AD 79 as an Athletics Arena, thus its oval shape but from 17th to 19th Centuries it was a scene of spectacular water pageants when the three fountains overflowed and flooded the Piazza. If you know the area you will remember the very expensive bars and restaurants on one side with artists, street performers and musicians entertaining the crowds. May I say that I have never had a drink or a meal there!

On the other side of the Piazza is the Church of St Agnes. Every year, on her Feast Day, two lambs are brought from Tre Fontane, the site of St Paul's martyrdom, to the Church of St Agnes. After they are blessed, they are taken and presented to the Pope, then they remain in the care of the Nuns. Just before Easter, these lambs are shorn and their wool is used to make the *pallia* for newly-appointed Metropolitan Archbishops.

A Pallium is made with strips of white woollen material with six black crosses marked upon it and they are given by the Pope to Metropolitan Archbishops, like George Stack to symbolize both their obedience to the Holy Father but also a sharing in the Pope's Authority. Each year prior to the ceremony they are placed upon the tomb of St Peter on June 29th (Feast of St Peter and Paul.).









We must remember that this is not the authority of a Dictator, but the Authority given by Christ to proclaim the Gospel.

"For Christ gave me the Authority to preach the Good News, not to preach in terms of philosophy, but out of love"

The Good News is a message of light, of hope.


"The People that walked in darkness, have seen a great light.
