MISSION NOT MAINTENANCE A number of people thanked me for being honest with you when I talked last week about the future of parishes within the Archdiocese. These were my thoughts not those of the Archdishop. I brought to your attention the number of active priests and their ages which will have an effect upon the Archdiocese in the near future. There are people within our community who have a greater love for the building not the community of people who make up the praying believing Parish of St. Patrick's Grangetown – Maintenance Rather than Mission

"Where two or three are gathered in my name you will find me there..."

We must wake up from our slumber and see the Institution you wish to maintain is that of the 19<sup>th</sup> Century, "the Parish of Our Grandfathers" it does not as we find ourselves in the 21st Century, both world and Church have moved forward, in other words "be prepared" to change and change often. We talked about the closure of Howells Department store because they like other shops have not adapted to the 21<sup>st</sup> Century then people stopped coming through it's doors and the same will happen to our churches.

Maybe we have enough clergy but too many Masses. We have a duplication of Masses in such a small area. Ask yourself this question "Do we need 2 weekend Masses?" With the amount of people attending it may be wiser to have one Mass that's "filling" the church rather than a church a quarter full. You would save money on heating, electric and sundries of all kinds. Thus this would allow the Priest freedom to serve other communities who do not have a resident Priest. I know I will ruffle a few feathers, GOOD at least you are thinking about it!

Our Parish like so many needs an increase of money. The main source of income is the weekly Collection. When was the last time you increased your offering? By the time you read this the price of petrol at Asda or Tesco would have gone up. You can't fill your car then expect them to accept your £20 when it's increased to £21.50. I can't do that with the engineers who serviced the boiler, give them the amount they charged 2 years ago as it's virtually doubled in price.

I understand for some, money is tight. But let us realise we must double the collection. There is very little in the bank, yes the money for the sale of the hall is ours, I repeat ours, held in our name within the Archdiocesan account as ALL

A few thoughts for you to think upon this week as I have them all day every day and the many problems I have for being Parish Priest of St. Patrick's.

I would have it no other way. I'm here for the long haul. As I've said before I'm proud to be a Priest of the Archdiocese and Your Father and Pastor in Christ.....Have a nice day!
