MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

I had my second 'jab' during the week, but as I've said so many times, let's not forget the millions in developing countries who have no chance of the vaccine within the immediate future. Nobody is safe, until everyone has been vaccinated.

We are a people who have come through a great trial, from Winter into Spring, darkness into light. This same could be said of the Church, and in particular St Patrick's. Last Thursday we celebrated the Feast of the Ascension. This is the time when Jesus, the Teacher, leaves the classroom, hands over work, but tells us 'I'll be back to check on you'.

When I was in school, there were times when I failed to carry out the teacher's wishes. I kept dreaming, looking out of the window, whilst others carried on with the school work. You can all picture this, because, like me, you were there.

Ascension Thursday, Jesus left His friends with work. There were those who listened and went about forming the Early Church and there were those who remained glued to the spot, not willing to move forward.

" Go out to the whole world, and proclaim the Good News.

I implore you to lead a life worthy of your vocation. Bear with one another charitably, in complete selflessness, gentleness and patience. Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit by the Peace that binds you together."

We have a new start, a second Spring within the Church, an opportunity to make our Parish one full of 'gentleness, selflessness and patience'.

Jesus will come back and check on the work He's left us. He will mark it, and ask us why we failed to listen!
