LECTIO DIVINA Each Wednesday during Lent at 6.30pm in the Sacristy, we will have the opportunity to listen to a passage from scripture, reflect on the words and see what message it contains for us. Lectio Divina is Latin for "Divine Reading". This method of prayer goes back to the early monastic tradition. There were no bibles for everyone and not everyone knew how to read so the monks gathered in chapel to hear a member of the community reading from scripture. In this exercise they were taught and encouraged to listen with their hearts because it was the word of God offering us all a deeper understanding of the living Word of God, allowing that Word to find a home within our hearts and minds. Lectio Divina continues to take place in all corners of the world and is a good opportunity to step back from the business of the day and experience the quietness and message of the Word of God.

<u>LENTEN LUNCH</u> This will take place every Friday during Lent (excl. Good Friday) at Holy Family Church, Fairwater. It will start at 11.45am-1pm with Stations of the Cross followed by home made soup, crusty bread & butter and tea & coffee and a raffle ticket.
